Married at 10, reading at 39

How Victoria found the meaning of life while learning to read and write

At age 10, most girls are thinking about school and friends. Not Victoria. She was married.

She had already endured so much. Her father died. She moved in with her aunt. Neither her mom nor aunt could afford school fees. “The situation was so difficult, I had no books or school shoes to wear. At the age of 10, I stopped.”

A life-changing invitation

Over the next 29 years, Victoria raised seven children while her husband worked as a fisherman in Mukonchi, Zambia. But she still couldn’t read or write.



“Thank you for the Bible-based Literacy materials. I am now a literate person, and the classes reminded me of how important it is to walk with God.”

Everything changed when a local church leader invited her to join a Bible League Bible-based Literacy class.

“What pushed me to join was that I struggled to read texts on my phone. I could not teach my children homework, and that made me feel so miserable.”

The joy of Jesus

Attending that Bible-based Literacy class brought the hope of Jesus and His Word into her life. Victoria beams, “What is special about Bible-based Literacy class is that I get to learn more about God. As I speak, I have seen the power of God in my life. A lot has changed. The Lord provides for my family in ways that I never knew possible. There is no day that my family goes to sleep with no food at the table.”

On graduation day, Victoria was thrilled. “It gives me so much joy that I can read and write. Most importantly, I have found Jesus Christ and the meaning of life.” She now spreads the Word in her village—letting everyone know about this life-changing opportunity.

Finding hope at rock bottom

How addiction and despair led Tania to her heavenly Father

Tania grew up without knowing her biological father. At 16, she became pregnant and married the father of her child. Their marriage was one of control, jealousy, and violence.

She spiraled into addiction—first alcohol, then cocaine. She recalls, “Alcohol didn’t do anything to me anymore.”

Hitting rock bottom

Overcome by addiction and her marriage in ruins, Tania hit rock bottom in her mid-20s. Fed up, she accepted her cousin’s invitation to church.

Last spring, Tania arrived at church in her village of San Francisco Magú, Mexico, hungover. She felt much like the Samaritan woman may have felt: ashamed and guilty. She walked in convinced that even if God was real, He would judge her. Instead, she found the healing power of a heavenly Father who loved her deeply.

Reaching other women


Soon, she joined a Bible League Bible study. As she grew in her understanding of God’s Word, it healed the wounds she’d carried for so long. She says, “Thanks to the Bible study, I understood who I am in Christ. God transformed

me and made me His daughter. It built my faith on solid ground."

She looked like a little girl on Christmas morning as she received her Bible. Tania recently completed the second part of the Bible study. She sees herself in the women Jesus forgave and restored. Now she wants other struggling women like her—women like Jacqueline (*story on page 7*)—to know they can experience God's healing, too.

Reading her way to healing

Your gift empowers people with literacy and God's Word

Today, Cynthia wears a bright smile as she holds her first Bible. She isn't smiling just because she has a Bible—she's smiling because now she can read it. For a long time, the 33-year-old didn't smile much at all.

She grew up in poverty in rural Zambia. Her family couldn't pay for school fees, so Cynthia never learned to read or write.

Joy in Christ

She married and had three children. But after 10 years of marriage, her husband divorced her. This was the darkest moment of her life, and it began to rock the faith she had in Jesus since childhood. She recalls, "I stopped praying and going to church. Life became meaningless. I lost hope. But because of the encouragement I got from my pastor, I went back to God to seek His face. I realized that there is joy in knowing Christ."

Not long after, she met a Bible League-trained Christian who invited her to join a Bible-based Literacy class. Cynthia was one of more than 50—mostly women—who eagerly signed up.

A new life

Cynthia completed the class and received a Bible. After years of not knowing how to read or write, she can read it herself. She beams, "I thank God that through Bible-based Literacy, I have known Jesus Christ to be the true Savior and Lord of my life."

Now Cynthia can help her children with homework—instead of the other way around. She has also started a baking business, creating a more stable life for her children and new husband.

Discovering Jesus at the nail salon

A manicure changed Jacqueline's life forever



You wouldn't think giving someone a manicure could be life-changing. But for Jacqueline (*above, right*), it was.

From a young age, Jacqueline searched for peace, healing, and a loving father. "I always wanted a father who loved me, but I grew up in a house filled with yelling, hitting, and crying," she recalls. Her alcoholic father's violence dominated her childhood.

Searching for hope

Like many young girls in her situation, she sought love in relationships—but found only pain and abuse. Partying, drugs, folk healers, and other religions offered no answers. "I felt like an empty being, without direction or purpose."

Everything changed when Tania (*pictured above left, see her story on pages 4-5*), who had recently become a Christian, came to her nail shop in San Francisco Magú, Mexico. She shared Jesus' love with Jacqueline and invited her to church.

Discovering her Father

Jacqueline felt Tania's words were a direct message from God. She attended church, then joined a Bible League Bible study. In God's Word, she discovered a loving Father who didn't judge or forsake her. "I always wanted a father who loved me. Today I discovered that I do have a Father: God."

"Thanks to you, the Gospel reached me. Thanks to God and His Word, I am no longer the broken woman I once was. Now I know who I am—a beloved daughter of God."

Jacqueline completed Bible League's entire Bible study program. Much like the Samaritan woman that Tania identified with and Tania's witness, Jacqueline now shares the Gospel with women at her nail shop. "Without God in my life, my life would still be just empty and full of pain."

Pastor Bernard's big dreams

One man's vision becomes eight churches—and counting

At 53, Pastor Bernard lives in rural Zambia with a vision to plant churches. Through Bible League's Church Planter Training, he gained the tools to multiply ministry. He was part of one of the country's first Church Planter Training classes.

"The training became a useful tool to plant and establish more churches," Bernard says. He planted eight churches across remote villages spanning multiple provinces and trained Bible League Bible study leaders in each location.

Now he's building a permanent 500-seat structure and plans to plant 15 more churches in 5 years. Each church Bernard plants helps train new believers who will lead more people to Jesus.

"I'm grateful I was invited to Bible League's training," he reflects. "Otherwise, I would have still been figuring out how to grow the ministry. The biblical materials you've provided for communities such as ours—you're transforming communities."
